Irish Horseracing Regulatory Board Notice

Declaration Of Non-Runners & Reserves

Trainers are requested to note that notifications of a non-runner or declaration of a reserve **can now be done via RAS** or on the dedicated telephone line (045-445645) at the Office of the I.H.R.B. up to 90 minutes before the time of the first race.

If using the Non-Runner/Reserve Telephone Line, the caller will be asked to provide the Trainer's Horse Racing Ireland account number and Trainer's date of birth. All calls are recorded for verification and security purposes. Veterinary certificates, where required, must be sent as usual to the Office of the IHRB within 72 hours. A Trainer failing to lodge a certificate within the time period shall be liable to a fine in accordance with Rule 194(v)(vi).

Trainers wishing to declare a Reserve a runner or a non-runner must also do so via RAS or on the same dedicated telephone line number by 10am for meetings, (other than floodlit meetings) during the months of November, December and January and by 11am for all other meetings including floodlit meetings otherwise the reserve will automatically be withdrawn.

If a rider has not been nominated for a declared reserve the Trainer must do so by the time fixed for declaration of a reserve listed within the paragraph above otherwise the declared reserve will automatically be withdrawn.

Declaration of reserves or of non-runners are no longer accepted at a race meeting.

Updates can be made via RAS anytime after the publication of Rider Nominations for the meeting up to the specified deadlines.

The dedicated line number (045 - 445645) is in operation from 9am on weekdays when there is a Race Meeting and from 8.30am on weekends and Bank Holidays in November, December and January.

Notice To Trainers Rule 194 (ii)(a)

In the event of an Owner having more than one declared runner in a race, it shall be the responsibility of the Trainer to declare to Horse Racing Ireland, for publication on the race card, a distinguishing cap for the owner's colours in respect of any declared horse or horses under his/her care in that race that is not carrying the owner's registered colours.

Therefore, please note that in such instances the declaration of colours must be made to Horse Racing Ireland via the Alternate Colours Facility on RAS or via email to the Publications Department publications@hri.ie by 12 noon on the day the declarations close unless otherwise stated.

Appeals & Referrals

Referral

The Referrals Committee, Mr Jack Rearden (Chairman), Mr C P Magnier and Mrs Justice Siobhan Keegan convened at Navan Racecourse prior to racing on Sunday, 9 February 2025 to consider the referral of Carl Millar (Rider) following the Irish EBF Paddy & Maureen Mullins Mares Handicap Hurdle at Leopardstown on 2 February 2025.

On the day, the Raceday Stewards enquired into the first approach to the Starter by the field but as Mr Millar was unable to attend the Stewards Enquiry, the matter in relation to his conduct at the start of this race was referred to the Referrals Committee.

At the Referrals Committee hearing, evidence was heard from Mr Millar. The Referrals Committee also watched a recording of the race.

In his evidence, Mr Millar accepted that there was no flag raised by the Starter, therefore there was no signal to approach the start or to start the race. Mr Millar stated that he had made every effort to hold his mount back to the best of his ability.

Having considered the evidence, the Referrals Committee found Mr Millar in breach of Rule 208(v)(b), in that he had failed to obey the instruction of the starter. Having considered Mr Millar's record in this regard, the Referrals Committee suspended Mr Millar for two racedays.

The referral was presented by Mr Paul Deegan, IHRB Stipendiary Steward.

Suspension dates: 23, 27 February

Referral

The Referrals Committee, Mr Justice Tony Hunt (Chairman), Mr Raymond J McSharry and Mr John Murphy convened online on Wednesday, 5 February 2025 to consider the application of John Joseph Hanlon (Trainer) to review the suspension imposed upon him.

Following a referral to consider potential breaches of the Rules of Racing, following a hearing on 30 August 2024, the Referrals Committee found Mr Hanlon in breach of Rule 272(i) and imposed a €2,000 fine and a withdrawal of Mr Hanlon's licence for a period of 10 months, with the possibility of the last five months of that term being suspended conditionally. Mr Hanlon was also found in breach of Rule 148(iii) and fined €350 in respect of that breach.

Following an appeal hearing on 14 October 2024, the Appeals Body directed that Mr Hanlon's licence should be withdrawn for a period of six months with the conditions as provided in the Referrals Committee decision, and that Mr Hanlon could make an application

on application to conditionally suspend the final three months if those conditions were met.

At the Referrals Committee hearing on 5 February 2025 to consider his application, submissions were heard from Mr John Whelan, solicitor, on behalf of Mr Hanlon.

In his submission Mr Whelan stated that he was making an application to suspend the three month balance of Mr Hanlon's suspension as allowed for in the decision of the Appeals Body. Mr Whelan also made a submission seeking liberty to apply early to the Licensing Committee so that Mr Hanlon could have his licence restored on the 14 February due to the new requirements under Rule 148(vii) which were not in place when the Appeals Body issued their decision. Mr Whelan provided the Referrals Committee with an undertaking that Mr Hanlon would not run any horse prior to 1 March and that Mr Hanlon will accept any condition imposed upon his licence.

Having considered the application, Referrals Committee permitted would lift the last threeand a half months of the suspension from the 14 February 2025 on two conditions 1) that Mr Hanlon does not commit any further breach of Rule 272 within the suspended timeframe, for the duration of the six months up to 1 June 2025, otherwise the suspended part could come into effect along with any other penalties that might arise and 2) from the period of the 14 February until 1 March, subject to the Licensing Committee acceding to Mr Hanlon's application, Mr Hanlon is not permitted to run a horse, meaning no entry could be effective under the license before 1 March 2025, although he would be permitted to notify HRI of Horses in his care, control and training from 14 February 2025 with running after the 1 March 2025.

The case was presented by Ms Christine Traynor BL, IHRB Head of Racing Regulation and Integrity. Mr Hanlon was represented by Mr John Whelan, Whelan Law Solicitors of Cashel, Co Tipperary.

The Licensing Committee convened on 13 February. Following interview with Mr Hanlon, the Licensing Committee acceded to the request and granted Mr Hanlon his licence from 14 February.

Appeal

Following the Bar One Racing Guaranteed Multiples Maiden Hurdle at Naas on 16 December, the Raceday Stewards interviewed K M Donoghue, rider of Hills Of Glory, concerning his use of the whip in the closing stages of the race.

Evidence was heard from Mr Donoghue who accepted he was in breach of Regulation 10.3(g)(frequency) and apologised for his actions. Having considered his clean record in this regard, the Raceday Stewards suspended him for two racedays.

Subsequently an appeal was lodged by Andrew Coonan, Solicitor, on 18 December 2024 on behalf of Mr Donoghue within the required 48 hours pursuant to Rule 256. The appeal was later withdrawn by Mr Donoghue on 2 January 2025, two days after the original suspended days, those days having been stayed pending the appeal hearing.

The IHRB notes that Mr Donoghue was entitled to lodge an appeal, subject to citing the specific

grounds and paying his deposit. However, a Senior Racing Official examined whether a potential breach of Rule 260 arose, whereby the appeal had been withdrawn within 72 hours of the suspension date's commencement without the consent of the IHRB. Taking account of the administration associated with the arrangement of the appeal dates, the deposit was forfeited in full.

The IHRB thoroughly considered the matter, including interviewing Mr Donoghue, who assured the IHRB that the late withdrawal of the appeal was not intended to harm the appeals process, and that he would always uphold the integrity of the sport.

Mr Donoghue accepted the decision of the IHRB with regard to the deposit and further acknowledged that if an appeal is to be withdrawn, it should always be withdrawn within the specified period provided for in the Rules of Racing.

Following the investigation and considering Mr Donoghue's commitment to resolving the matter and in recognition of his cooperation throughout the process the IHRB has concluded that this matter does not meet the threshold of seriousness to warrant a hearing before a Referrals Committee and confirmed that no further action will be taken in this case.

Referral

The Referrals Committee, Mr Nick Wachman (Chairman), Mr Anthony Byrne and Mr John Murphy convened via Zoom on Wednesday, 5 February 2025 to consider a referral from an IHRB Senior Racing Official in relation to the identification of Krak, trained by Stephen Crawford, who was due to run in the in the Sign Up To GavinLynchRacing.com Maiden Hurdle on 16 December 2024 at Naas.

On the day, the Raceday Stewards received a report from Ms Joan Taylor, IHRB Veterinary Officer, that she was unable to positively identify Krak as she could not find the microchip. It was stated by Mr Ross Crawford, Authorised Representative for S R B Crawford, that he could not account for the missing microchip as they had not encountered the problem before. The Raceday Stewards ordered the withdrawal of Krak in accordance with Rule 90 (iv) and referred the matter to a Senior Racing Official.

At the Referral Hearing, the committee heard evidence from Mr Crawford, trainer.

In his evidence, Mr Crawford stated that he took immediate steps to rectify the issue with the microchip once he became aware of the matter. Mr Crawford submitted documentation to the IHRB in relation to the horse which confirmed that the microchip issue had been rectified.

Having considered the evidence, the Referrals Committee were satisfied that Mr Crawford was in breach of Rule 90(iii) but in light of the matter being addressed, they took no further action.

The case was presented by Ms Christine Traynor BL, IHRB Head of Racing Regulation & Integrity.

The Acting Stewards interviewed Ms G. Benson, rider of Knockiel Synge, placed fourth, concerning her use of the whip in the latter stages of this race. Evidence was heard from the rider concerned.

Having viewed a recording of the race and considered the evidence, the Acting Stewards were of the opinion that the rider was in breach of Regulation 58. 3.(i) in that she had used the whip without allowing her mount at least three strides to respond. Having taken her previous record into consideration, the Acting Stewards suspended Ms G. Benson for one Point to Point raceday.

The Acting Stewards interviewed Mr P.J. Cawley, rider of Born By The Sea, placed second, concerning his use of the whip in the latter stages of this race. Evidence was heard from the rider concerned.

Having viewed a recording of the race and considered the evidence, the Acting Stewards were of the opinion that the rider was in breach of Regulation 58. 3.(g) in that he had used the whip with excessive frequency. Having taken his previous record into consideration, the Acting Stewards suspended Mr P.J. Cawley for three Point to Point racedays.
